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## **Building Report February 2018 BOE Meeting**

**Classroom Enhancement Program Grant Recipients:** SES was excited to hear the news that members of our staff were recipients of two of the CEP grants. A summary of these grants are listed below. Thank you to the Sabetha PTO for making this opportunity available to our staff members in order to enhance our educational environment.

- STEM/Mystery Science Activities: Various activities/resources that will help support science instruction in the classroom. Requested by Mrs. Edelman, Mrs. Streett and Mrs. Werner for the 2<sup>nd</sup> grade classrooms
- Sensory activities: Tactile letters that can be handled and manipulated by students. Requested by Mrs. Hann, Kindergarten Teacher.

**K-3 Bus Safety Program:** On February 1, K-3 students attended a presentation discussing bus safety. Trooper Don and Buster visited SES to share information to students regarding the proper ways to board, ride, and exit a bus. It was very engaging and informative.

**Parent/Teacher Conferences:** Conferences were held on the evenings of February 5 and 7. Meetings were scheduled with select parents to discuss both academic and behavioral progress.

## MTSS Implementation:

- As of the week of January 23, adjustments were made to student intervention groupings based on the review of winter screening data in the areas of reading and math. Progress monitoring was adjusted to reflect these changes as well.
- At the February 2<sup>nd</sup> PLC meeting, SES staff focused on 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter behavioral data to problem solve specific behavioral concerns.
- On January 31, Mrs. Heiman, Mrs. Herrmann, and myself travelled to Lansing to participate in a panel
  discussion on the implementation process of MTSS. This panel was held to provide information to
  the Lansing elementary BLT members who are currently beginning the process of restructuring their
  MTSS system.

**Bullying Prevention Assembly**: On February 26, SES students will attend an assembly at SMS presented by the KC Wolf. The program, entitled "Don't be a Bully – Be a Buddy" This is one of their newest programs and it focuses on treating everyone with Respect and Kindness despite our differences. The Kansas City Chiefs have provided education programs to students for 28 years.
