Minutes of the Regular Meeting, Monday February 14, 2022 6:00 PM Held at the BOE Office, 1619 S. Old Hwy 75, Sabetha, KS

Board President Leslie Scoby called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Mrs. Scoby led the meeting with the Pledge of Allegience. Stan Keim led the meeting with a prayer. Board members present were Kathy Lippert, Phillip Buessing, Kent Saylor, Anissa Bloom, Stan Keim, and Jim Scoby. Superintendent Todd Evans and Board Clerk Deb Damman were also present, along with others listed on the attached sign-in sheet. The meeting was broadcast live on YouTube for the Public.

President Scoby presented the following changes to the 3.A. I. Consent Agenda:

- G. Resignations add Joy Butch Renz, Axtell custodial, effective June 30, 2022.
- I. Personal Day Requests add Linda White
- J. Authorize Mr. Evans to sell approx. 200 folding metal chairs
- K. Transfer \$3,899 from Code 63 to Capital Outlay to pay for Axtell playground equipment
- L. Transfer \$13,084.82 from Code 63 to Capital Outlay to pay for capital improvement projects at Axtell
- M. Accept a gift of \$315.73 & \$60 from the Blue Jay Music Boosters and Dayra Menold for the SHS Band

Motion was made by Kathy Lippert, seconded by Phillip Buessing, to accept the agenda as amended. Motion carried 7-0.

2. I.I. Public comment, Administrative Reports, and other updates:

Kathy Lippert provided information on future legislation and stated that she is following bills related to education, school budgets, KPERS, and COVID. Superintendent Evans informed the Board that KASB is watching HB 2662, Transparency Act, which would increase work for teachers and other staff.

Kent Saylor said parents appreciated the student-led conferences this year.

Mr. Evans informed the Board that the District is still searching for a Chemistry/Physics teacher, and provided statistics on the shortage of science and math teachers graduating in Kansas this year.

Mr. Evans updated the Board on the work that Edelman's is planning for the District. The Wetmore Split Systems Project will be from May 23 to June 3, the Axtell Rooftop project is scheduled for June 13 to June 17, and the Sabetha rooftops and mini split system is scheduled for June 27 to July 22. Mr. Evans also presented the Year-to-Date Expenditure report, reported that the SMS Gym Roof was almost complete, and provided information about the Greenbush Virtual School contract, which will be dropped next year.

Jay Hermann, AHRS, presented bids for the Axtell Renovation, Sabetha Elementary School Addition and Renovation, and the Wetmore School Renovations, and answers questions from the Board. Alan Schmitz, AHRS, shared the Project Schedule with the Board. Mr. Evans informed the Board that an anonymous donation for \$500,000 is available if the entire project is approved.

After discussion by the Board, a motion was made by Kathy Lippert, seconded by Kent Saylor, to accept the bid as outlined with alternatives 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 for \$4,893,794. (Included in this is \$200,000 estimated for the Axtell portion of the project). Motion carried 6-1, with Jim Scoby voting no. The AHRS Bid document and Project Schedule are attached to these minutes.

Theodore Demonchaux from CIVIUM presented alternative plans for the Axtell fire escape. The final plan will be determined by the Board in the future.

- 3. The GMP includes a construction contingency which is for AHRS's use and protection and is intended to cover possible additional costs incurred including but not limited to: price fluctuations, subcontractor default, scope gaps, schedule advancement cost, overtime, ect. This contingency is not for owner related items or changes in work.
- 4. The GMP includes the allowances on the Bid Tabulation. Allowances will be drawn from as they are used. At the end of the project positive balances will be returned to the owner, negative balances will be credited to the CMAR contract.
- 5. The GMP does not include AWI QCP job specific certification for all casework as per specification 064023.1.5.B.1
- 6. The GMP does not include a custom three-coat fluoropolymer on metal wall and roof panels. A standard two-coat fluoropolymer system is included.
- 7. The GMP includes ASI temperature controls instead of the specified TAC controls. The existing HVAC units will be switched over to ASI controls. The entire elementary school will be controlled by an ASI system.
- 8. The GMP assumes a construction start construction will start no later than April 18th, 2022
